

Dr. Charles Hadlock is currently a Professor of Business Administration at the University of Pittsburgh, where he teaches courses in Valuation, Corporate Finance, and Mergers and Acquisitions. Before joining the faculty at Pitt Business, he served as the Associate Dean of Faculty at the Eli Broad College of Business at Michigan State University, where he held the Frederick S. Addy Distinguished Chair in Finance. Dr. Hadlock has previously taught at M.I.T. and the Universities of Chicago, Michigan, Virginia, Illinois, and Florida. He received his Ph.D. in Economics (1994) from M.I.T. and his B.A. in Economics and Mathematics (1989) from the University of Michigan. He has won numerous teaching awards at all levels and has extensive experience teaching customized executive education programs for corporate clients.

Dr. Hadlock's research interests are in the areas of corporate finance, management incentives, and executive labor markets. His papers have appeared in leading journals in finance, economics, and accounting, including the *Journal of Finance*, the *Journal of Financial Economics*, the *Review of Financial Studies*, the *Journal of Accounting and Economics*, the *Journal of Business*, the *Journal of Financial and Quantitative Analysis*, and the *RAND Journal of Economics*. He received the 2011 and 2014 Michael Brennan Prize for the best paper published in the *Review of Financial Studies*. In 1997, he won the Merton Miller prize for the most outstanding research published in the *Journal of Business*.
