# **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

This course is an introduction to the major components of information systems, including database management system (DBMS), some elements of software engineering, graphical user interface (GUI) design, standalone and Web-based information systems. Students will have hands-on exercises and assignments using the Visual Studio.NET programming environment and Microsoft Access (a relational database management system).
